Charitable Foundation Report

The Foundation is on a fiscal year ending in October, the same as the Club, but most of us think in annual year terms so the figures expressed here are annual figures.

During 2024, our Club members donated \$6,585 to the Foundation. This came from 29 members or 58% of our total membership. Of course, we think this percentage should be higher, but we express our sincere thanks to all who donated. Thank You.


As for the health of your Foundation, it is in a very strong position. Our investments have brought in a net of \$94,228.68 this year. We distributed \$2,604.26 for our Perfect Attendance Project, \$21,000 in Scholarships and \$18,000 in Grants a total of \$41.604.20.

Annual grants were made to Wings of Hope Ranch, Patrick Henry YMCA, Angi Miles Happy Reading Program and one-time grants went to the Ashland Theater, Beyond Boundaries and the Kiwanis Disaster Assistance Program for SW Virginia. Our recurring program commitments currently total \$51,604 annually. Some scholarship recipients did not apply for all the approved years.

Remember the Foundation in your donation plans as we strive to support local children's projects and always welcome your input, advice and charitable suggestions for future donations.

If you have to take a RMD from your IRA, you can have the custodian send a check directly to the Foundation which will be a tax-free stock sale transaction on your behalf. Of course, we are a 501 (C) 3 entity so donations are tax deductible on your annual tax return.
